Whilst learning the practices of the Art of Hosting, we will be exploring questions around what it will take to begin to build and move towards a shared set of principles and ideas for a future that could work for all of us in our country Zimbabwe and in our different communities and organizations wherever they are.



This is a training – and an exploration – for everyone who is interested in finding new ways of working with individual and groups in ways that build on the best of what is; ways that nurture personal leadership, deeper connection, collective intelligence, shared learning and wise action fit for our time.

We will work with theory, example, and practice. We will learn of the methods while engaging in the conversations that matter on how to harness the energy and spirit of this moment in time to build a foundation for the new that is emerging in our country and communities.
